



WHY I CHOOSE THE BLACK WOODS BLIZZARD TOUR

Every February, when the nights are long and the temps usually dip low, something amazing happens in northern Minnesota — hundreds of riders and volunteers come together for the Black Woods Blizzard Tour. On the surface, it looks like a snowmobile ride. But for me, and I think for everyone involved, it's so much more. It's a mission. It's a family.

The Blizzard Tour began in 1999, when four Duluth men — Randy Bannor, Larry Bannor, Dennis Nelson, and Greg Sorenson — rode around Lake Superior to raise awareness for ALS. A year later, the official ride launched with 38 riders. It rained, the snow disappeared, and organizers thought they'd have to cancel. But those 38 said, "No — we're coming whether we ride or not." That moment defined the spirit of this event and gave birth to the motto we live by today: Never Surrender.

While I am not a rider, every year, I see how this event brings people together — riders, families, sponsors, and volunteers — all rallying around one cause: to fight ALS and support those living with it. The money raised doesn't just fund research; it directly impacts people's lives by providing adaptive equipment, communication devices, and support services that help families navigate an incredibly tough journey.

When you see the determination of someone living with ALS or hear from a family who's been helped by Never Surrender Inc., it changes you. It reminds you that hope truly does drive life — and that each of us can play a part in keeping that hope alive. I volunteer because I believe in what this event stands for. I believe in the riders who brave the trails no matter the conditions — even in years with little snow — and I believe in the Blizzard Tour family that refuses to quit.

That's why I keep coming back — to lend a hand, to share the miles, and to make sure no one facing ALS ever feels alone.

3rd Annual Tomassoni Tour - Cycle for ALS Breaks Fundraising Record



The wheels keep spinning, and so does the impact. The Tomassoni Tour – Cycle for ALS celebrated its third year on the scenic Mesabi Trail this and achieved its largest fundraising total yet: \$321,000 to support individuals and families battling ALS.

Despite a rainy forecast, spirits soared as 95 cyclists and 25 dedicated volunteers came together to ride for a cause that continues to grow stronger every year.

Among the cyclists was former Minnesota Twins great Terry Steinbach, who has returned each year since the event began.

"I am super pumped to be here for a third year," said Steinbach. "This event is growing in popularity with lots of new cyclists. My wife, Mary, joins me, and we have a great time. I'm proud to be involved with Never Surrender Inc – who does an outstanding job with all their events."

The Tomassoni Tour is one of three signature events hosted by Never Surrender Inc, alongside the Black Woods Blizzard Tour and the Kolar Toyota ALS Fishing Tournament. Collectively, these events have raised an astonishing \$2,277,872 in 2025 alone, fueling local ALS research and providing critical support such as durable medical equipment and communication devices to people living with the disease.

The weekend also celebrated outstanding contributions within the ALS community. At Saturday's banquet:

- Ardy Nurmi-Wilberg received the Todd Lauer Award, honoring passion, perseverance, and dedication to ending ALS.
- Ski Hut was recognized with the B2 Bank US Steel Sponsor Award for their unmatched commitment to the event's mission.

"Honoring a Legacy"

The event is named after the late MN State Senator David Tomassoni, whose tireless advocacy secured \$25 million in funding for ALS research and care in Minnesota. His vision and passion continue to fuel the fight.

"David believed deeply in building a better future for families affected by ALS," says a friend. "This ride is about carrying that legacy forward—mile by mile, rider by rider."

The Tour isn't slowing down. Planning is already underway for next year's ride on September 17–19, 2026.

ALS Research Opportunities:

Never Surrender Expanded Access Program

Never Surrender Inc., through Massachusetts General Hospital, has generously provided funding to the University of Minnesota to support Expanded Access Programs (EAPs) in ALS. We have completed enrollment in one EAP under this program and are moving forward with two additional expanded access programs. Multicenter ALS Imaging Study

The purpose of the study is to test new biomarkers of ALS using MRI scans. A biomarker is a measurable characteristic that can be used as an indicator of a particular disease state. Identifying biomarkers in ALS will help test new treatments and may help us make diagnoses earlier. Biorepository to Support ALS Research in Minnesota

The Minnesota ALS Biorepository at the University of Minnesota is a state-sponsored effort to provide critically needed samples of biological specimens to advance ALS research. The Biorepository collects blood and other biological specimens from people living with ALS, healthy individuals without ALS, and people with some other neurological diseases. In addition, the biorepository coordinates donation of brain and spinal cord specimens obtained after death from people who had ALS, to further ALS research. HEALEY ALS Platform Trial

The HEALEY ALS Platform Trial is a research trial that tests the safety and effectiveness of multiple treatments in ALS. A regimen is a specific course of treatment, each with a different study drug. We are doing this research to find out if different treatments have an effect on ALS. We also want to find out if these treatments are safe to take without causing too many side effects. Clinic-Based Multi-Site ALS Natural History & Biofluid Study

This is a clinic-based natural history study and registry. Once a participant enrolls in the study at the clinic all data collection will occur remotely. At this point in time, we are only able to enroll patients who are currently being served by the Natural History Consortium ALS Clinics. Biospecimen (e.g. blood) collection will be done at the UMN ALS Clinic in alignment with the participant's care schedule. Access for ALL in ALS

Funded by the NIH/NINDS, the Access for ALL in ALS Consortium (ALL ALS), is a community of two coordination centers and 35 research sites across the United conducting combined States. а longitudinal natural history study and biomarker collection study for ALS. This study will include both people currently living with ALS, and asymptomatic ALS gene carriers.
